The Soprano's Season Six Part 2 The personal and professional adventures of Tony Soprano (James Gandolfini) continue in this sixth, and final, season of episodes. As the show builds to its climax, Tony finds his life in danger as Phil Leotardo (Frank Vincent) assumes control of the Mafia following the death of Johnny Sack (Vince Curatola). As the tension escalates even Tony's faithful henchmen, Christopher (Michael Imperioli), Paulie (Tony Sirico), and Silvio (Steve Van Zandt) find their lives in danger. D.L. Hughley Unapologetic D.L. Hughley proved he was unapologetic when he threw his own provocative remarks into the already fiery debate over Don Imus and the Rutgers University women's basketball team. That's why the title of his first HBO special is especially fitting. Weighing in on a variety of hot topics, from the current political climate to the life and death of Anna Nicole Smith, he never fails to hit a nerve with his brand of in-your-face comedy. *HBO*

The Reaping In this thriller a college professor who refutes mysteries and so-called miracles with scientific evidence. When science teacher Doug Blackwell (David Morrissey) invites Katherine and her former teaching assistant/current colleague, Ben (Idris Elba), to his hometown of Haven, Louisiana, to investigate a river whose water has turned blood-red following the mysterious death of a local boy, the cynical professor is forced to find her own faith. The river of blood is just the first in a series of strange occurrences in Haven. It seems that each of the 10 plagues from Exodus is being manifested, in order. The citizens of this Bible Belt town are convinced that 12-year-old Loren McConnell (AnnaSophia Robb) is responsible for her brother's death and for the strange events. Soon, Katherine finds herself questioning everything as memories from her past suddenly infiltrate the present in her search for the truth. The Deep South setting is both beautiful and creepy--particularly Doug's classic antebellum mansion, and the swamps where the McConnell family lives. Swank is reliably solid as Katherine, a woman of faith who lost everything important to her and turned to science for answers. Young AnnaSophia Robb, a young actress to watch, has a captivating screen presence. Brits David Morrissey and Idris Elba round out the main characters, with Morrissey a convincing Southern gentleman and Elba a man who overcame his tough life on the streets to become a professor. Stephen Rea also appears as Father Costigan, a link to Katherine's sad past. *Warner*

Jim Norton: Monster Rain Comedian Jim Norton pushes every envelope and crosses every line with his trademark brand of over-the-top humor. In this HBO special from Washington, D.C.'s Lincoln Theatre, the "Opie and Anthony" co-host tackles celebrities, dating and prostitutes. Roseanne Season 9 In its ninth and final season, Roseanne hits delightfully surreal territory when the Connor family wins the lottery. The once struggling, working-class family must suddenly deal with its newfound wealth, resulting in wonderfully odd moments that include Roseanne and Jackie battling terrorists, attending snobby cocktail parties in New York City, and mingling with celebrities like Robin Leach, Tammy Faye Baker, Steven Seagal, Arianna Huffington, and James Brolin. But Bo-Peep loves Tom-Tom, the piper's son, so it's up to Stannie Dum and Ollie Dee to come to the rescue, with the life-size wooden soldiers they mistakenly made in the toy factory., Pocketful of Miracles In Frank Capra's final directing effort, bag lady Apple Annie (Bette Davis) convinces her long-absent daughter (Ann-Margret) that she's a wealthy socialite. Mr. Brooks Kevin Costner stars as Earl Brooks, a man whose seemingly perfect family and status in the community hide an ugly secret. Brooks constantly says the plea of an addict--the Serenity Prayer--but he's not in the grip of drugs or alcohol. Instead, his neat little bow tie belies a man with an urge to kill. Though he's staved off that desire for two years, it has returned thanks to the efforts of his evil inner voice (William Hurt). He is caught in the act by a man who calls himself Mr. Smith (Dane Cook), but Mr. Smith doesn't want to turn Brooks in. The smarmy amateur photographer wants to learn from Brooks's methodical ways and become a killer himself. Meanwhile, a tough cop (Demi Moore) hunts for the man responsible for deaths all over Portland while she deals with issues in her own life. Mr. Brooks presents a fascinating portrait of a man at war with himself. As the devil on Brooks's shoulder, Oscar winner Hurt adeptly alternates between menace and glee, adding to a resume already replete with varied roles. Though Costner is mostly known for playing nice guys (Field Of Dreams) and charming rogues (Bull Durham), his performance as the tortured killer is interesting to watch, and he rises to the challenge of playing a completely different character than the kind he is known for. Mr. Brooks is an engaging thriller that goes into the fractured mind of a murderer, while also delivering an intriguing maze of multiple subplots. *Fox*

James Ellison plays the Scotland Yard inspector tasked with getting to the bottom of the mystery in this atmospheric thriller directed by John Brahm and co-starring Heather Angel., Hangover Square Struggling composer George Harvey Bone (Laird Cregar) falls for Netta (Linda Darnell), a scheming dance hall singer who wants to steal his newest song. When he discovers her selfish motives, Bone flies into a rage and kills her in this classic thriller. But Bone has no memory of the crime: So dedicated is he to his craft that discordant sounds make him black out, and he doesn't realize that he's capable of such monstrous violence. *Fox*

The Tripper A bunch of hippies descend on a small woodsy town for a concert, little realizing the terror that awaits them: an axe-wielding Ronald Reagan running amok in a one-man war against drugs. The sheriff (Thomas Jane) tries to control the madness but a corrupt mayor and a greedy promoter (Paul Reubens) insist the free-love festival must go on no matter how high the body count. It's a scrappy little low-budget horror indie given some star clout thanks to David Arquette (the sheriff in the Scream films) in his directorial debut. Jason Mewes (aka Jay of Jay & Silent Bob fame) is one of the more acid-happy hippies. Lukas Haas plays a doe-eyed folk-singer type who tries to stay relatively sober since his uptight new girlfriend (Jaime King) is already recovering from some previous trauma. The music is punchy (Fishbone play at the concert) and the dialogue spot-on. There's also some nifty psychedelic special effects and, of course, plenty of gore for those inclined. *Fox*

The Initiation of Sarah Sarah's (Mika Boorem) mysterious powers have always been a bone of contention between her and her non-magical twin, Lindsey (Summer Glau).
